MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Wings of Hope soared in 2025. By working with local leaders to advance education and health care, it has become attractive to donors, who have recognized the value of this partnership to community self-sufficiency. Their funds have given Wings of Hope lift not only in its organizational structure but also in the development of its humanitarian projects.

Wings of Hope also welcomed Summer Slevin as Executive Director in 2025. With her background in strategy, operations, and communications, she has strengthened

the organization's online presence, improved the donor database, and helped guide fundraising and marketing initiatives. These efforts have expanded donor engagement and strengthened Wings of Hope's capacity to advance its humanitarian projects.

Great progress was made in 2025 on three of Wings of Hope's international humanitarian projects. In Kenya, the quality of medical care for the Maasai considerably improved at the Osiligi Medical Dispensary for expectant mothers and at the Osiligi Medical Center, which now provides dental care after its office was established in January and dental practice began during the successful two-day health fair in June. Since 2023, this medical complex has served over 45,000 patients and delivered over 500 births. More than 1,200 patients are seen monthly. As an example of impact, referrals to the nearest hospital dropped significantly, from 1,728 in 2023 to just 72 in 2025, as the complex continued to advance in healthcare quality.

The Ditinn villagers in Guinea celebrated the 2025 installation of a water well, which was partially funded with a grant from the Rotary Club of Central Africa. The quality of life for this village community will considerably improve once the water distribution center is complete in 2026. The displaced Burmese in Myanmar have also been supported with the successful Myanmar Cultural Celebration fundraiser in October. This event featured talented Burmese performers in colorful traditional clothing and raised funds for needed medical equipment and supplies. In addition to continuing these efforts, more attention in 2026 will be given to the establishment of a vocational training center in Kumasi, Ghana and the educational scholarships for young women interested in health care from the Gilgit Baltistan region of Pakistan.

Since Wings of Hope's founding in 2023, it has grown in strength and purpose, carried forward by the hope-giving energy of people who believe in empowering communities to reach their full potential. This past year has shown how powerful that shared vision can be. Thank you for joining Wings of Hope on this journey. Your generosity and belief in our mission help us to carry Wings of Hope towards a future where more people can access the education, healthcare, and opportunity they deserve.

IMPACT OVERVIEW

Wings of Hope Global Cooperative (Wings of Hope) donor funding in 2025 was directed to projects in Kenya, Guinea and Myanmar to support our goal of creating more self-sufficient and empowered communities throughout Africa and Asia. The quality of health care has considerably advanced for the Maasai in Kenya with approximately \$38,000 dedicated to medical hospital improvements, purchases of medical equipment and the construction of staff housing for the onsite OBGYN. We exceeded our 2025 goal of fundraising \$20,000 to advance the development of the Osiligi Maternal Hospital in Kenya. Thanks to a generous \$5,000 donation from the Rotary Club of Central Africa, Wings of Hope had the \$10,000 needed for the installation of a water well in the Ditinn village of Guinea. The MidAtlantic Burmese diaspora and friends participated in our local Maryland fundraiser that generated nearly \$9,000 for medical supplies and equipment to support displaced Burmese in Myanmar. Approximately \$30,000 has been spent on Wings of Hope operations of which most of it contains the \$24,000 salary for its Executive Director. This expense has been supported by Founder donations.

In addition to furthering these projects in 2026, more attention will be given to the vocational training center project in Ghana and the educational scholarships planned for young women interested in health care in northern Pakistan.

MYANMAR

In October of 2025, Wings of Hope hosted a Myanmar Cultural Celebration fundraiser at the Glenelg Country School in Ellicott City, Maryland. This cultural arts event featured talented Burmese performers and raised almost \$9,000 to support medical supplies for displaced Burmese in Myanmar.

GUINEA

Wings of Hope raised more than \$9,000 towards the \$10,000 installation of a water well in the village of Ditinn in Guinea. A grant of \$5,000 was given to Wings of Hope to complete this project from the Rotary Club of Central Africa. A water well was installed in 2025 and villagers are receiving water generated to three faucets. A water tower is being installed in 2026, and to sustain the operation of the well, a business plan is being developed whereby water will be bottled and sold to support the team involved in the maintenance and operation of the well installation.

KENYA

Given the urgency to establish a maternal hospital as a life saving measure for women in need of additional assistance for critical birthing procedures, Wings of Hope worked in the first months of 2025 with the design team of Build Health International to develop an interior virtual tour of the proposed hospital. This video has inspired donors to make major contributions for the maternity hospital fund, which is presently in excess of the \$20,000 achievement goal for 2025 to begin the hospital project with the development of the 2026 campus plan.

In addition to the hospital fund, a dentist office was established and facility improvements were made in the Osiligi Medical Complex in the first six months of the year. This is the second dental chair in the Narok county of over one million people. Wings of Hope also attracted a small team of six U.S. professionals to participate in the planned Maasai & Safari Adventure in Kenya. Partnering with the medical team of Narok Country in Kenya, these professionals contributed to the successful two-day health fair which reportedly served approximately 800 Maasai, who benefited from dental and vision clinical practice, maternal and pediatric counseling, physical therapy, and medical prescriptions.

The U.S. travelers learned from the local OBGYN the need for facility improvements and medical equipment needs. As a result of that visit, an autoclave, a nebulizer, an incinerator for medical waste, a solar panel for back up energy, newborn equipment and delivery and recovery beds were purchased. Additionally, fundraising provided tiling for the floors and bathroom, as well as interior paint in order to create a more sanitary environment. Funds were also raised towards the completion of a vision office for diagnostic and operative procedures and a pharmaceutical lab in the Osiligi Medical Complex. We are currently fundraising to complete the vision office, pharmaceutical lab and maternal hospital by the summer 2026.

Wings of Hope also provided on-going educational scholarships for two aspiring OBYGN physicians in the Narok region of Kenya.

Finally, thanks to a generous donation of twenty-six laptops to support the digital education of students at the Ole Punyua Primary School in Kenya, Wings of Hope transported them by air from California to Maryland and then in a container ship from Baltimore to Nairobi. These laptops arrived at the Ole Punyua Primary School in February 2026 and have been joyfully appreciated by its students and teachers.



FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

FINANCIAL NARRATIVE

In 2025, Wings of Hope Global Cooperative generated \$120,254 in total income, with 57% coming from donors and community supporters and 43% contributed by founder David Weeks. We also exceeded our fundraising goal for the advanced maternal hospital, raising \$20,700 toward the project, surpassing our \$20,000 target for the year. Operational expenses totaled \$30,010, supporting organizational development, communications, and the establishment of an Executive Director role to strengthen the organization's capacity and growth. The majority of expenditures, \$53,280, were directed toward projects in Kenya, Myanmar, and Guinea. These funds supported progress toward the Osiligi Maternity Hospital in Kenya, medical supplies for displaced communities in Myanmar, and the installation of a well in Ditinn, Guinea. Remaining funds will support continued project development and new initiatives across Wings of Hope's five partner countries in 2026.

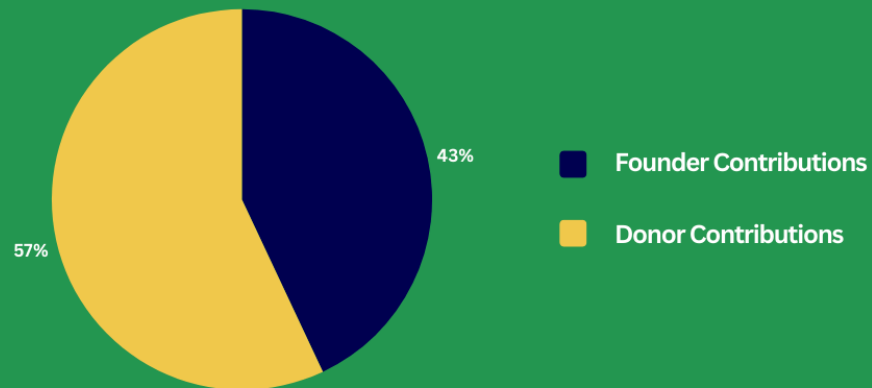

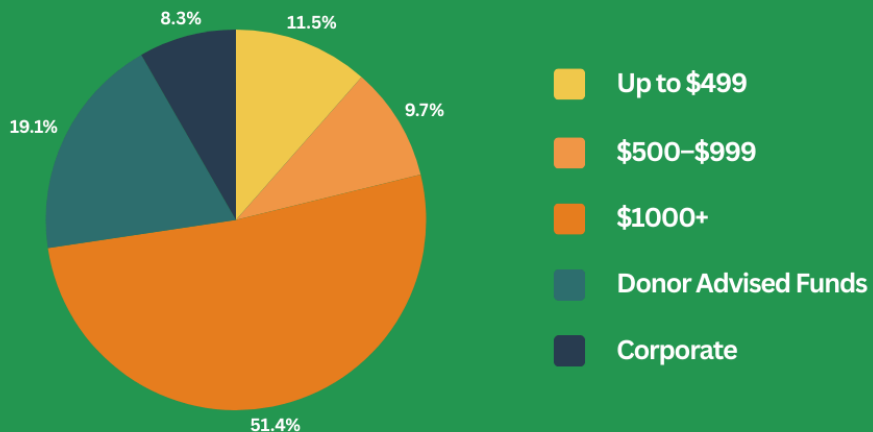
Contribution Types

Types of Donors

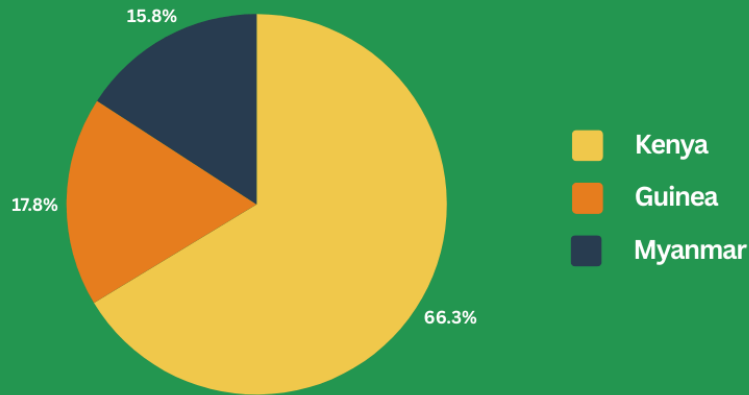
Our donor community spans a wide range of contribution levels, with major gifts of \$1,000 or more representing the largest share of donor support.
